Saint of the Week - St. John Vianney

John Vianney was born near Lyons in France in 1786 and died aged 73 at Ars in 1859. He overcame various obstacles, including little education and lack of means, to be ordained a priest. He served in a remote parish as the Curé of Ars, where his sanctity attracted many thousands of visitors. Noted for his preaching and confessional counsel and is honoured as a model for parish clergy. Pope Pius XI canonized him in 1925 and his feast day is celebrated on <u>4th Aug</u>.

In today's Gospel (John 6: 24-35) the crowds meet up again with Jesus at Capernaum and they are wondering how He got there (He had walked across the water). Jesus understands their motives and explains that they have come not because of the miracles He has performed but because He had fed them on the previous day, and they are now hungry again for more food. He continues to tell them that their true hunger is not for physical food but for food that feeds the soul - "Do not work for food that cannot last but for the food that endures to eternal life".

This statement of Jesus causes the crowd to call to mind the time of the Exodus when their "ancestors ate manna in the desert," as we heard about in today's first reading. Jesus then says to them: "I am the bread of life." He is the true bread come down from heaven that will feed people's souls and lead them to eternal life.

Do we often feel unsatisfied with all this world has to offer? If we follow only the ways of society and a secular lifestyle, we will always be left yearning for more. Only God can satisfy the deepest hungers of our heart. This week will you let Him be your "daily bread"?
