St Ingrid 13th Century Swedish Saint and Sweden's First Dominican Nun.

Fri 3rd Sept

St Gregory the Great 6th Century Pope and Monk. Musically talented and oversaw the development of Gregorian Chant.

St Mac Nissi 5th Century Monk and Bishop. Co-Patron Saint of the Diocese of Down & Connor.

Saint of the Week—St Fiacre (Fiachra)

Fiacre was born in Ireland at the end of the sixth century. He was raised in a monastery where he became a monk and studied herbal medicine. In time he had his own hermitage and perhaps a monastery, possibly near St. Fiachra's Well at Cill Fiachra near Bennetsbridge in Co. Kilkenny. Crowds flocked to him because of his reputation for his holiness, cures and a reputation for the healing of fevers, tumours and cancers. He eventually left Ireland and went to a hermitage in France where he died around 670.

His feast day is celebrated on 30th August.

Gospel Reflection (Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23)

In Jesus' time, the Pharisees, who were very powerful people, and the ordinary Jews washed their hands and their arms all the way up to the elbow before eating their meals. This was to protect them from illness and to comply with their many religious traditions. They expressed surprise when they saw that Jesus' disciples had not washed their hands in the traditional way and they questioned Jesus about this. Jesus then became angry with the Pharisees, and He said that they were just following their traditions without really thinking about God. This was not enough because for Jesus it was very important for people to really show love for God in all their actions.

The gospel challenges the religious hypocrisy of the Pharisees and some of the religious leaders of the time who robbed religion of its meaning by focusing on laws and outward appearances. Their teaching does not take people deeper into their faith and causes others to turn away from religion altogether. In many ways Jesus is reminding us too that our religion has to be better than an external show. It's really about an inner conversion, calling us to a change of heart where necessary. It's about deepening our personal relationship with Jesus, with God. This means placing our trust in Him as completely as we can. True cleanliness consists in putting the Word of God into practice, a word of encouragement or a random act of kindness towards others even at the expense of one's own comfort.
