Gospel Reflection - Who do you say I am?

In today's Gospel (Mark 8: 27-35), Jesus asks the disciples about what others say about Him. They answer, Elijah, John the Baptist or one of the prophets. He then asks the same question directly to the disciples – "Who do you say I am". Peter speaks for all of them when he announces that they believe Jesus to be the Christ which means the Messiah, the anointed one.

Now that the disciples have acknowledged Jesus as the Christ, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his earthly ministry: he will be rejected, must suffer and die, and will rise again after three days. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely. The image of Christ that Jesus is giving is not the image of the Messiah that Peter was expecting. Jesus then teaches the crowd and the disciples about the path of discipleship. To be Christ's disciple is to pick up your cross and follow Him. This is not always easy, but God is always with us to strengthen us and give us courage especially during difficult times.

All powerful God, You are present in the whole universe and in the smallest of Your creatures. You embrace with Your tenderness all that exists. Pour out upon us the power of Your love, that we may protect life and beauty. Fill us with peace, that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one.
