#### SAINT OF THE WEEK - ST. PETER CLAVER

Peter was born in Catalonia, Spain in 1580. At the age of 22 he joined the Society of Jesus (*Jesuits*) and was sent to study philosophy in Palma on the island of Majorca. Here he met the man who had the greatest influence on his life, Brother Alphonsus Rodriguez, who was then 80 while Peter was only 25. Alphonsus became his best friend and spiritual director. It was the old brother who encouraged the young student to go as a missionary to Columbia in South America. This was a centre for the slave trade at that time and Peter is reputed to have baptised over 300,000 African slaves over a forty-year period. He was canonised in 1888 and his feast day is celebrated on 10<sup>th</sup> Sept.

#### THE SEASON OF CREATION - 1<sup>ST</sup> SEPT. TO 4<sup>TH</sup> OCT. 2021.

The Kilmore Laudato Si' Group have recently met and have come up with the following suggestions as to how a parish/parishioners could implement some of the principles contained in this Papal Document on the environment:

<u>The truth about disposable plastic water bottles!</u>: It takes 3 litres of water to produce a 1 litre bottle of water. Keep a jug of water in the fridge instead of waiting for the tap to run cold.

<u>Are we a throw away culture!</u>: It takes around 2,700 litres of water to make a single cotton t-shirt and it takes almost 500,000 litres of water to extract just 1 kg. of gold.

<u>Do you need the latest mobile phone!</u>: There is up to 30 times more gold in a tonne of old mobile phones than in a tonne of gold ore.

Wash laundry at 30°C when possible : It cuts CO2 emissions, saves energy and helps the environment.

**<u>Reduce overall meat & dairy intake</u>** and have a weekly meat-free days: around 16,000 litres of water is consumed to produce just 1 kg. of beef.

Plant a tree or trees: which absorb carbon and increase oxygen levels in the atmosphere.

**<u>Boil only the amount of water you need in the kettle</u>**: It saves on energy, time and electricity costs.

<u>Reduce driving speeds</u>: It results in less fuel consumption and reduces emissions of other pollutants from diesel vehicles.

<u>Don't leave electrical appliances on stand-by</u>: 1 kwh. of electricity from a plug socket takes almost 3 kwh. of energy to produce.

<u>Use double sided printing paper</u>: it takes more energy to make 1kg. of paper than it takes to make 1kg. of steel.

<u>Check out your font size</u>: switching from the font 'Arial' to 'Century Gothic' saves 30% ink on printing.

<u>Enjoy more time in nature</u>: it connects us to all of Creation and has numerous benefits for our wellbeing.

## Gospel Reflection (Mark 7:31-37).

In today's Gospel, Jesus is journeying through the land of the Gentiles where during a previous visit there He healed a person possessed by a demon. Because of this, the crowd now bring to Jesus a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment. We now witness another of Jesus' healing miracles by physical means using touch and spittle. In a similar way the Church today continues to celebrate the sacraments using physical means such as the laying of hands, blessing with holy water and anointing with holy oils. Sacraments are important in our lives because we believe that God's grace is given to us through these physical signs.

Following this healing miracle, and as was the case in previous miracles, Jesus asks those around Him not to tell anyone about it. But good news takes root and spreads quickly throughout the region. Again, Jesus is trying to put the emphasis on the everlastingness of spiritual healing as opposed to the temporary nature of physical healing which only lasts for the duration of our earthly lives. Spiritual healing will eventually lead us to eternal life in the presence of Our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.
