### Saint of the Week - St. Anthony of Egypt.

Anthony was born in the year 251 at a village near Memphis in upper Egypt. His parents were Christian and well-to-do. When they died – he was only twenty years of age – he found himself in possession of a large estate and with the care of a younger sister. Then came the first moment of reality, when he heard the words of the gospel, 'Go, sell what you have and give it to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven'. That is exactly what he did. Having seen to the care of his sister, he himself retired into solitude to live a life of prayer and fasting. Anthony is called the 'Father of Monasticism' and rightly so, for countless millions have followed his example through the centuries. His feast day is celebrated on 17th Jan.

### Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel (John 2: 1-11), Jesus, his mother Mary, and the disciples were at a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The wine had run out and Mary asked Jesus to help because she was aware of the powers He had. But He responded "Woman why turn to me? My hour has not yet come." (Of course, Mary was present again when His hour did come a few years later). As this was a Jewish wedding, it would have been a big embarrassment to have no wine left for the guests and so with His mother's persuasion, Jesus turned water into wine and the celebrations continued. This was good quality wine too as remarked by the steward to the bridegroom, "you have kept the best wine till now".

This was Jesus' first public miracle and perhaps one of the most memorable miracles to many Christians today. The miracle shows us how special and important Jesus is. It shows us that He is the Son of God and that He can do anything. Jesus never rests and is ever at work turning our difficult situations into abundant blessings. Like the guests, we too can look forward to a place where we find the 'good wine' ahead of us rather than behind us, where most might expect it to have been. While we cannot work miracles, we can still make real changes that make a difference to our own lives and the lives of those around us and to the environment. Through seeing Jesus' miracle, the disciples believed in Him and through our actions we hope that others will see that we believe in Jesus too.

<u>Prayer for the week</u>: Dear Lord, Your first miracle was at a wedding feast where You changed water into wine. At the Last Supper, Your great gift to us was the changing of bread and wine into Your Sacred Body and Blood. Help me to receive You worthily into my body, my heart and my soul through the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Amen.
