Gospel Reflection

Luke 5: 1-11

In today's Gospel we hear about a miraculous catch of fish at the lake of Gennesaret. Jesus is teaching from Simon's boat and when He is finished, He turns to Simon and instructs him where to lower the fishing nets. Simon and others have been fishing throughout the night and have not caught anything and think that this effort would be futile. However, Simon obeys Jesus and lowers his nets into the deeper water as directed because he knows that Jesus is a person of authority

whom he respects. They catch so many fish that the nets begin to tear and the boats begin to sink. They seek help from other fishermen nearby. Jesus' presence has created abundance out of scarcity.

Simon then falls to his knees and becomes a follower of Jesus immediately. He calls Jesus "Lord" and feels unworthy to be in Jesus' presence. This marks a



turning point in the relationship between Jesus and Simon. Two of Simon's partners are also named as witnesses to the event described in today's Gospel: Zebedee's sons, James and John. At this time Jesus' words are addressed only to Simon. He gives Simon a new job, telling him that he will become a different kind of fisherman: No longer will he catch fish, instead he will catch people. Therefore, Simon gets a leadership role within the community of disciples. His task is to bring others to Jesus. At the end of the Gospel we hear that all the fishermen along with Simon also left their nets and followed Jesus. Simon who was also known as Simon Peter and then Peter still influences the Church today as we call the pope "the successor of Peter."
