Feast Days during the coming week

Mon 14th: St Valentine - 3rd century Roman saint whose remains are enshrined in Whitefriar Street Church, . Associated with romantic love.

Tue 15th: St Joseph of Antioch - 8th century Syrian deacon, hymnist and patriarch of Antioch where he was martyred in 792.

Wed 16th: St Julian of Egypt - an imperial soldier in the Egyptian army. Known as one of the 'Martyrs of Egypt' and is patron saint of hospitality.

Thur 17th: St Fintan - 6th Century Irish monk associated with Co Laois (see below).

Fri 18th: St Colman of Lindisfarne - 7th Century West of Ireland monk who was educated on the island of Iona.

Sat 19th: St Odran - An Irish monk and a disciple of St Patrick. Was the first Christian Martyr recorded in Irish history.

Saint of the Week - St Fintan

Fintan was a sixth century monk born in Leinster. He was educated by St Colum in Terryglass, Co Tipperary. The severity of the rule and penitential practices there so influenced Fintan that his own foundation in Clonenagh, Co Laois also acquired a reputation for austerity. Fintan died in 603 and his feast day is celebrated on 17th Feb.

Gospel Reflection

Luke 6:17, 20-26

In today's Gospel Jesus and His twelve disciples come down to level ground where a large crowd have gathered to listen to Him and to be cured of their diseases. Jesus says: that those who are poor will be happy, because the Kingdom of God belongs to them; that those who are hungry will be satisfied and will have enough to eat; that those who cry will be happy, for their tears will change to laughter; that those who are hated and badly treated for believing in Him will be happy, because they will be rewarded in heaven. He goes on to say that those who are rich have everything they need now, and so do not need the gifts of heaven and that those who have more than enough food now, will go hungry, and that those who laugh will be sad and mournful.

This may appear to be a strange Gospel to us as what we are being told is the opposite of what we would normally expect. Those often thought to have been forgotten by God are called blessed and those whom we might ordinarily describe as blessed by God are being warned about the peril of their ways. Riches, possessions, laughter, reputation etc... are not things that we can depend upon as sources of eternal happiness. They not only fail to deliver on their promise but our misplaced trust in them can lead to our downfall. Our ultimate peril is in misidentifying the true source of our eternal happiness. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. This Gospel challenges us to examine our present situation in the context of our ultimate desire to reach the Kingdom of God.
