GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the full version of today's Gospel (*Mark 5:21-43*) we are presented with two healing miracles of Jesus. One very public miracle even though the recipient sought privacy and the second one seemingly leading up to a public miracle, became private. Of course, all miracles are signs of the wishes and plans of God for us.

Jairus, who was an official of the synagogue, was a man of deep faith and his daughter was seriously ill. He pleaded with Jesus to come and make her better. A crowd gathered and followed them. In the crowd was a woman who was suffering from haemorrhage for many years. As her faith was strong, she believed that by even touching Christ's garment, she would be healed. And so it was, and Jesus knew that power had left Him, and the woman was forced to come forward and reveal herself.

Now word had arrived that the daughter of Jairus had died. When Jesus heard this, He said, "*Be not afraid, only have faith.*" On reaching the house of Jairus, a crowd had gathered. Jesus dismissed them except for a few disciples and the girl's parents. He then took the girl's hand and immediately she returned to life and got up. Those present were instructed not to let anyone know about what had just happened.

Both Jairus and the woman never gave up. They waited patiently until the plan of God was fulfilled for them. The woman had waited for years, and when her chance came, she took it in faith. Also, Jairus demonstrated his faith on behalf of his daughter by persistently inviting Christ until He visited his house. Both miracles teach us that we must be patient and have faith in order for our miracles to happen.
