GOSPEL REFLECTION



In today's Gospel (Luke 6: 27-38) there are many themes including mercy, forgiveness, love of enemies and generosity. Jesus does not only teach about forgiving the enemy, but asks His followers go a bit further in both loving and praying for their enemies; "Give to everyone who asks of you", says Jesus. And He also say's "Treat others as

you would like them to treat you." Jesus wanted all his listeners to go beyond the conventional rules of the time, to go the extra mile, so to speak. That extra mile is to love without expecting anything in return and to love even those who ignore you. He also asks for generosity, not only to those from whom we can get something in return, but to people who cannot afford to pay back such generosity. Jesus wants his followers to imitate God who is constantly kind even to both the ungrateful and the selfish. He also asked His disciples to be merciful as God is merciful and that they should neither judge nor condemn others. More still, he wanted them to understand that when they forgive others, God will forgive them their sins and when they are generous, God will even be more generous to them.

So, this week, let the teaching of Jesus be translated into our daily lives. Let us ask God for the grace to love our enemies with sincerity. Jesus did not only instruct His disciples about the need to forgive enemies, but He practiced what He preached. When he was hanging on the cross, He uttered these famous words for those who had crucified Him, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." The amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.
